FROM THE PASTOR

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem.

Luke 9:51

This last week the two of us in the office have gotten a little head start on spring cleaning. It feels like that time of year again, even if it is the end of February. As the weather becomes more pleasant (as if we had a period of time this winter when it wasn't) we begin to itch to get all of our springtime activities started. I've even heard a few farmers mention being ready to get back in the fields.

But maybe it's not all that awkward to be thinking about spring so early. We have just entered the season of spring in our church year. That is what Lent means after all...spring. And while our services reflect a time of penitence we are very much in the springtime of the church year.

We spend the season of Lent preparing ourselves for the cross. We put away the typical celebrations that remind us of Easter and enter into a time of reflection and confession. A sort-of spring cleaning of our souls. We focus on our sinfulness and human nature and ask God specifically for the cross – the only way of souls become truly clean.

We put away the "Alleluias." We hold off on singing the "Hymn of Praise." We replace the cross on the altar with a crucifix. The Gospel readings focus on the death of Christ. It seems like a time of sorrow, but really it's a time for spring cleaning. We temper our celebrations so that we might look deep into our souls and beg for God's forgiveness and yearn for the empty cross of Easter.

I encourage you to take some time this Lenten season and do some spring cleaning. Empty out the storage units, go through the closets, throw away broken and unused items, do some deep cleaning. But also take time this Lenten season to reflect upon yourself. Clean out your soul. Repent and ask for forgiveness. And be prepared to change. The point of confession is so that we might turn and be different. So that we might show sorrow for our ways and try to do better. So that when Easter comes we might celebrate with a clean heart.

Some of you have already received the forms and signed up for electronic giving. It's very easy to do.


